



Call for Papers:

The Society for Modern Greek Studies calls on graduate students (research or taught) from universities in the UK and abroad to participate in its annual Graduate Research Colloquium. The Colloquium is a student-led event that aims at bringing together students currently undertaking research in the field of Arts & Humanities related to the Modern Greek world (1453-present), providing them the opportunity to present their research, discuss their ideas with their peers but also with distinguished scholars, and gain important feedback on their work.

The Society welcomes submissions from graduate students registered at universities outside the UK but can only refund travel expenses (up to £50) if they are payable to a UK bank account. Priority will be given to students registered at UK universities.

The Colloquium will take place at King's College London, Strand Campus, on Friday 24 May 2019. Venue TBC.

Proposals, including an abstract of 200 words maximum as well as a brief biographical note, should be submitted by email to:

Papers should be in **English** and should not exceed 20 minutes. Participants will be notified of the selection of their abstracts by no later than 22 February 2019.
